In line with the changing and easing of public health measures, we have implemented some changes over the past week here in Gaelscoil Mhic Aodha.

Mask wearing is no longer a requirement in schools. Staff and student/pupils can continue to wear a face covering/mask if they wish to do so on a personal basis.

As the general requirement for physical distancing in society no longer applies, schools are no longer required to maintain class pods and bubbles. Children can now work and play with children in different groups in their classrooms. We allowed the classes to mix at lunchtime today and the children were very excited to play together. Classes will also mix next week for our Seachtain na Gaeilge activities.

Antigen testing arrangements for children in primary schools will continue. As we no longer have PODs, we will send a note via Aladdin to the entire class to notify parents of a positive case.

The requirement to stay at home if you have symptoms of Covid 19 remains. ASYMPTOMATIC close contacts do not need to restrict their movements. Please see HSPC Information Note I have sent with this letter.

Hand hygiene and enhanced cleaning in school will continue.

Seachtain na Gaeilge is upon us and we have lots of fun activities planned for the coming week and a half – art competitions, sport blitzes, quizzes, drama workshops and treasure hunts to name a few. Our Céilí and Green Day return this year! On March 16th children may wear green clothes to school and all classes will take part in a Céilí. Children finish at 12pm on March 16th as staff have Primary Language Curriculum in-service training.

We are all looking forward to a fun filled Seachtain na Gaeilge!
